#### **Book with 2 authors:**

- Last name, First name and First name Last name. *Title of Book*. City of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium.
- Thackeray, Frank W. and John E. Finding. *Events That Changed the World in the Eighteenth Century*. Westport, Connecticut: Greenwood Press, 1998. Print.

### Book with 3 or more authors: (et al = and others)

- Last name, First name, et al. *Title of Book*. City of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium.
- Wysocki, Anne Frances, et al. Writing New Media: Theory and Applications for Expanding the Teaching of Composition. Logan: Utah State UP, 2004. Print.

## Two or More Books by the Same Author:

- Last name, First name and First name Last name. *Title of Book*. City of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium (Print, Web, other).
- ---. *Title of Book*. City of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium (Print, Web, other).

#### A Work in an Anthology or Compilation:

- Author. "Title of Essay." Year of publication. *Title of Collection*. Ed. Editor's Name(s). Additional information. City of Publication: Publisher, Year. Pages. Medium.
- Murray, Judith Sargent. "On Equality of the Sexes." 1790. *The Norton Anthology of Literature by Women: The Middle Ages Through the Turn of the Century.* Ed. Gilbert, Sandra M. and Susan Gubar. 3<sup>rd</sup> ed. 1 vol. New York: W.W. Norton & Company Inc., 2007. Print.

### **Article in Reference book (dictionary / encyclopedia):**

"Title or word." Entry num. or Def. 4b. Title of reference book. Edition. Year. Print.

#### **Article in a Journal:**

- Last name, First name. "Title of the article." *Journal title*. Volume number. Issue number (year of publication): Pages. Medium.
- Piper, Andrew. "Rethinking the Print Object: Goethe and the Book of Everything." *PMLA* 121.1 (2006): 124-38. Print.

## Newspaper:

Author(s). "Title of Article." *Title of the Newspaper* Date of Publication, ed.: Page Numbers. Print.

#### **Online Scholarly Journal:**

Author(s). "Title of the Article." *Title of the Periodical* volume number.issue number (Date of publication): page numbers. Name of database. Medium. Date accessed.

- If no author is listed, begin entry with the title
- nd = no publication date
- np = no publisher or place of publication
- n.pag. no page number provided
- When working with an anthology: write Trans., Ed., or Comp. These are used to identify translators, editors or compilers if needed.
- For dates: day, month, and year
